About LWSB

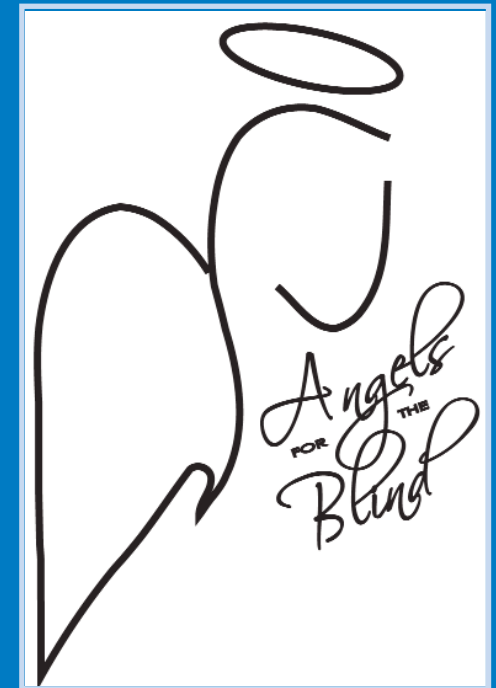

As the world's largest and most comprehensive rehabilitation center of its kind, LWSB has served more than 9,200 people from 50 states and 58 other countries. The goal of the center is to prepare the individual who is blind or visually impaired to function independently in our "sighted" society.

LWSB offers a complete personal adjustment program in 30 areas such as travel, communication, home management, and 13 vocational programs ranging from small engine repair to computer networking. In addition, LWSB provides individual and group counseling, as well as career training services.

THE AUXILIARY

Angels for the Blind is an auxiliary to benefit Lions World Services for the Blind (LWSB) in Little Rock, Arkansas. The auxiliary concept was created by former board member, Willie Oates, several years ago. Members are recruited through a yearly membership drive and by personal invitation from an Angels member.

MISSION STATEMENT

The mission of Angels for the Blind is two-fold. The auxiliary will endeavor to raise the level of public awareness of services offered at LWSB for adults who are blind or visually impaired. The members also plan, organize and implement annual special events, such as Treat Your Treasure, to raise funds for the services, equipment and supplies necessary to provide training and rehabilitation programs at LWSB.



FUNDRAISING

The auxiliary raises money for the Amy Pais Scholarship Fund, which provides scholarships for elderly Arkansans who are dealing with vision loss due to the aging process. The scholarships cover one month of specialized training at LWSB, thus allowing recipients to remain independent in their own homes. Training and services are offered in the following areas:

- Orientation and Mobility
- Assistive Technology
- Communication Techniques
- Techniques of Daily Living
- Low Vision Clinic

MEETINGS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

The general membership meets bimonthly, at noon on the third Tuesday of the month. Responsibilities include five hours of direct service, annual dues of \$35, and attendance at as many meetings as possible. Membership is open to anyone who is inspired by the mission of LWSB.
